









Human Rights Based M&E

- 1) ... explicitly takes positive human rights change as the ultimate definition of impact;
- 2) ... measures the *quality* as well as the *results* of development interventions, inputs etc;
- 3) ... measures changes in capacity, specifically in terms of capacity to demand & to deliver human rights;
- 4) ... employs methodologies that are non-discriminatory & sensitive to gender & risks of increasing vulnerability;
- 5) ... measures, and contributes to, empowerment through methodologies, communication, etc that raise awareness of human rights & raises expectations & capacity (of rights-holders & duty-bearers) to demand & deliver change.





Human Rights Based Smart Indicators Measure

- 1) ... the quality, as well as the impact, of the intervention (eg participatory, empowering etc);
- 2) ... progress towards delivery of the full content of the relevant human right(s), eg is health care "available, accessible, acceptable & of good quality" etc.;
- 3) ... changes in capacity: specifically rights-holders' capacity to demand and duty-bearers capacity to deliver human rights;
- 4) ... changes in perception, eg trials/elections etc, are not only required to be "free and fair", but also need to be <u>seen</u> to be so;
- 5) ... disaggregate data (qualitative and quantitative) by gender & relevant human rights vulnerabilities (age, disability, ethnicity, migration, other legal/social status).
