











## Closing the gap Systematic approach for transformative change





#### **Example Factsheet Gender ARI on SGBV**


#### Disaggregation dimension (gender and age):

- Men and Women (aged above 18)
- Girls and Boys (aged under 18)

**Rationale:** If survivors of SGBV receive required support, then they can reintegrate into daily life and society and pursue their life in wellbeing, because they are able to recover from their suffering and traumata, regain their physical integrity and confidence and get justice and compensation for the assaults.
