Gender Equality & Social Inclusion (GESI)

1 - 3 December, 2020

Background

Gender equality and social inclusion (GESI) are crucial issues in Eastern Europe, a region that faces growing inequalities, even more so in the face of the Covid-19 pandemic. In line with Agenda 2030 and its Leave no behind imperative, Switzerland is committed to promoting gender equality and social inclusion in all its Cooperation programs. This takes place both through mainstreaming, as well as via targeted and specific projects on gender equality and social inclusion.

The issues of gender equality and social inclusion are to a large extent overlapping and closely interlinked. They both deal with a lack of realization of rights by individuals, often as a result of their identity combined with the policies, institutions and norms in the society in which they live. Besides, the gender gap that women have to face (be it in employment, education or other sectors) is often increased for certain population groups (intersectionality). The instruments and tools that have been developed by SDC and other agencies over the years to fight gender inequality and ensure that all members in society can live in dignity combine a people-centered approach with systemic changes. This requires to apply, along the project cycle management (PCM), some "analytical lens" – gender and social inclusion - which will help us, development practitioners, to design interventions that are most appropriate to respond to people's needs.

Objectives

Organized by the Cooperation with Eastern Europe (CEE) Domain, the purpose of this Regional Online F2F Gender Equality & Social Inclusion is to provide a platform for exchange of experience and learning among field offices. It marks an additional step in the social inclusion peer learning process, following the Roma inclusion seminar series, and aims to respond to the request of gender focal points for more peer to peer exchange expressed during the 2019 global Gender F2F. The specific objectives are the following:

- o Clarify the Gender and Social Inclusion (GESI) concept and how it links to the Leave no one behind (LNOB) agenda;
- o Reflect on the Covid 19 impact and responses from a GESI perspective
- o Learn from existing regional and global practices in GESI programming and mainstreaming;
- o Reflect and identify ways of improving GESI programming and mainstreaming in practice;
- Define next steps and organize concrete exchanges and support were relevant.
