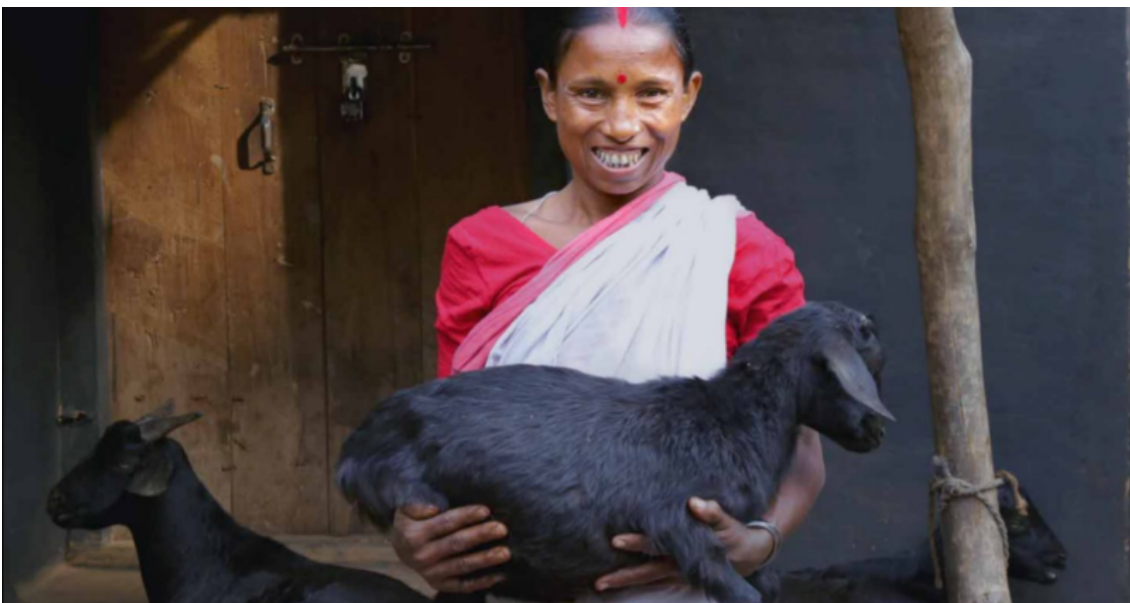
## Why poverty targeting might not be the right thing to do

## Outcomes or opportunities: what should equality really look like?

“Inequality is under attack – but what should equality really look like?” This is the question asked by a recent article of the Guardian’s Inequality Project. The author argues that equality will only be achieved if we shift the focus from inequalities of opportunity to inequalities of outcomes: “we need to move away from the tired lies of “equality of opportunity”, “meritocracy” and “social mobility”. Instead, we need to work for equality in terms of actual results and outcomes”. This echoes an ongoing debate on the notion of inequality and how development practitioners should address it.
