


Figure 1. Cows number as of 01 January 2022, thsd. heads, by region, all types of milk producers




Figure 2. Cows number as of 01 January 2023, thsd. heads, by region, all types of milk producers

In 2022, the total number of cows in Ukraine, excluding the temporarily occupied territories in 2014, decreased by more than 200 thousand heads, which for comparison is 30% of the number of cows in Switzerland.

However, despite the war and the blockade of seaports, Ukraine exported in value 344.6 million USD of dairy products in 2022, which is 39% more than in 2021.

### **Basic Information**

**The Objective** of the project 'UKRAINE: emergency dairy inputs' is to ensure food safety in the dairy sector of Ukraine and improve food security and access to healthy nutrition for the Ukrainian population through dairy products.

### Outcome 1:

4 de-occupied regions of Ukraine that suffered from military actions are supported in retaining their production potential in dairy sector of 300 milking farms with 110'000 cows (23% of total in Ukraine).

### Outcome 2:


Farmers' access to necessary input materials, including materials needed to maintain milk hygiene is improved and farms' liquidity is increased to bring the sector back on track after 3 months of temporarily Swiss support.

### Losses by category, USD mln

The monetary value of physical assets destroyed, stolen or partially damaged (but still fit for repair or refurbishment) as a result of hostilities and occupation.



The prolonged occupation of the southern and south-eastern regions of Ukraine and frequent shelling of the liberated and frontline areas makes it difficult to produce and sell milk, which is the main reason for the stopping of farm operations and the reduction of livestock.

To partially compensate these loses to the milking farms Switzerland plans a continuation of this project in 2023 with allocation of CHF 2.3 ml (if approved by the Parliament in June 2023).





### Transformative Capacities | System Thinking

**Systems analysis** to understand change dynamics and path dependencies?

- "System" was highlighted in the announcement of the FSS
- Awareness for system thinking was raised
- Many interviewees reported a silo thinking (Action tracks, solutions)

"It's supposed to be a systems summit and it started by cutting the system in pieces, as has been done in the past with the results that we know. And therefore to me, to cut it in five or six tracks and then each track in two or three action areas, and each action area then has a number of game changing solutions that are supposed to form a cluster, it is cutting the pie in smaller and smaller pieces."



### Transformative Capacities | Transformative Visions

### Targeted Knowledge of future system and consistent transition pathways

- Transformative visions for systemic change were seldom expressed
- Majority referred to "old" economy-ecology-society definition (1990s)
- Agroecology as potential guiding vision for transformative change









### Transformative Capacities | Procedural Justice

Information disclosure, local knowledge mobilization, institutional representation

- Outreach of the Summit was huge
- Many were left with the feeling that their participation had no influence
- A vast majority of our interviewees said that the Summit process had a rather opaque organization
- It seems that power imbalances between stakeholders have not been adequately tackled by the organizers







### Some conclusions

- All three aspects system thinking, transformative visions and participatory justice - were addressed partly but not sufficiently
- In view of the research results, the transformative impact of the 2021 UN FSS is expected to be rather low; existing systems will be stabilized.
- The transformative potential of such a summit would be higher, if it would use the tools to increase transformative capacities
- This in turn would require transformative leadership by the Summit organizers and participants



### **Background and Methods**

- Participatory observation of the Summit process
- qualitative analysis of
  - official FSS documents,
  - articles and websites and
  - 21 expert interviews
- Interviews were coded and analyzed using MAXQDA
  - Representatives of all five Action Tracks, from member states in Asia, Europe, Africa, Oceania and South America, members of the High Level Panel of Experts on Food Security and Nutrition (HLPE), civil society organizations and the Philanthropic Foundations, members of the Champions Group and a participant of the Alternative Summit launched by the CSM
