



Virtual Training on Conflict Sensitivity & CSPM for SDC's Regional Office Horn of Africa - Kenya, Ethiopia, Somalia Module 2 – Tuesday 1st September, 2020

Objectives of the virtual training

The overall purpose of this virtual training is to provide participants with practice-oriented tools and methods on how to integrate conflict sensitivity and the Conflict Sensitive Programme Management (CSPM) at the context, project/programme and institutional levels.

Module 1: Foundation of conflict sensitivity

This module will take place on 6-7 July under the lead of Swisspeace (separate agenda).

Module 2: Conflict sensitivity at the institutional level

Under the lead and coordination of the SDC's Unit "Fragility, Conflict and Human Rights", the Module 2 will focus on institutional aspects of the integration of conflict sensitivity / CSPM, and on how existing practices of CSPM could be better reflected in institutional processes and documents, building upon the reflexions and group exercises carried out in Module 1.

The learning objectives of Module 2 are therefore the following:

- (1) Link the CSPM approach with the **SDC's Comprehensive Risks Management** approach; deepen the understanding of the added value of conflict sensitivity in SDC's supported projects, programmes and processes;
- (2) Enhance practice to integrate conflict sensitivity within **SDC's institutional processes** and documents like Entry Proposals, Credit Proposals, Annual Reports, Cooperation Programmes and their Monitoring Systems.


