Title	Int'l <i>policy</i> and national <i>realities</i> : New Deal review and Agenda 2030 – how can SDC contribute to "out of fragility"?
Focus and Key questions	In addition to the 10 Principles on Engagement in Fragile States, the "New Deal" serves as guidance and reference for international peace- and statebuilding agendas. Accordingly, SDC's Peace- and Statebuilding Strategy defines SDC is work in fragile contexts. The new SDG 16 of the Agenda 2030 is another very important point of reference: "Promote peaceful and inclusive socieities for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels." How doe wewrk with these policies in practice? What are the realities? We will discuss the following questions: • How does the New Deal work in practice (example from Somalia), what does it mean in terms of programming, policy dialogue and what role can SDC/Switzerland play? • What does it mean in practice, for a relatively small donor, to work in highly politicized contexts? How can Switzerland make a difference? What are the risks/constraints • What does it mean in practice to work in context where humanitarian/development/political/military actors are present, with often conflicting agendas • What does it mean in practice to work through governmental structures? • What role can Switzerland play in often geostrategically determined peace deals? • What is Switzerland's engagement at global level related to the New Deal? Chances of our position as INCAF co-chair. • What does it mean in practice to work with civil society and include them in the process? What was your office's experience? • How can SDC contribute to a country-led and country-owned transitions out of fragility? • How can SDC contribute to support for credible and inclusive political dialogue? • What lessons have we learned from the field regarding the implementation of fragility assessments and compacts? • How inclusive is/were the fragility assessments and/or peace deals in your country?
