<b>Title</b>	<b>Reduction of fragility causes</b>
<b>Focus and Key questions</b>	<p>Fragility is multidimensional (violence, justice, institutions, economic foundations, resilience) and so are the peace- and statebuilding agendas to which SDCs wishes to contribute:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Where and how did we contribute to the reduction of fragility?</li><li>• How do we assess our relevance and impact?</li><li>• What are our objectives in contexts that show less positive change or worsen?</li></ul>
