Tanzania

SDC priorities for new strategy in 2019

- Mainstreaming governance & media into Global Programmes Health and Employment & Income
 - o Use existing tools like score cards (get experience from Rwanda score card – contact Theophista)
 - o Linking media and other CSOs to create stories for broader community
- Gender mainstreaming
 - o Ownership of media outlets (none are in female hands in Tanzania right now) because owners set up media house for a particular purpose, so gender matters!
 - o Need to investigate barriers to women in decision making positions
- Sustainability of organizations and change
 - o Invest in quality and original content; it is the starting point to revenue
 - o Start supporting owners in building institutions that guarantee the autonomy of the news room
 - o Help media outlets know their value chain
- Security (missing – but be aware of political sensitivity)
 - o Digital & cyber security training
 - o Emergency funding in case of property loss or damage
 - o Physical security training (share knowledge from other contexts)
- Innovation & tech
 - o Caution: not all startups are worth supporting – don't get excited about every new thing
 - o But don't approach these new ideas in same old modalities
 - o @DDLGN: Clarify the concept and encourage it from partners (concept note: percentage of resources to innovation)
 - o Online platforms for journalists to learn (moocs) – e.g Rwanda & TMF

Mozambique

New programme LGMI 2018 – 2022

- Reflection with implementing partners about the possible integration of media sector support
- Find the best partner / mechanism to work with in this subject
- Long-term programme on media that can include capacity building, sustainability, protection of journalists, etc.
- Media landscape research
- Advocacy to support the media to continue with their work

Egypt

- Demand-based support
- Access to information (legal archives, judicial archives)
- Parliamentary reporting
- Capacity building of media practitioners is not an area of priority (crowded / saturated - impact has to be assessed)

Grand Lacs

- Appuyer un programme large de protection des journalistes
- Appuyer les collectifs / syndicats des professionnels des médias pour la défense

Burundi

- Assurer la survie et le développement des initiatives qui existent
- Faire arriver l'information au grand public, à l'intérieur et à l'extérieur, y compris aux réfugiés
- Poursuivre les formations aux journalistes burundais (in – out), y compris les questions de sécurité
- Appuyer les activités de lobbying et plaider pour la mise en place de lois facilitant l'accès à l'information et le cadre légal de la presse en ligne
- Soutenir le jumelage des radios sur des thématiques régionales moins politiquement sensibles

RDC

- Appuyer les formations spécifiques à la couverture des élections, y compris la sécurité des journalistes
- Accompagner les professionnels des médias dans la valorisation et diffusion des lois sur la presse
- Assurer l'appui en matériel pour une plus grande couverture régionale, ex. Nord-Sud

Rwanda

- Appuyer l'autorégulation des médias (valable)
- Appuyer le journalisme d'investigation aussi pour la région
