Variations in federal designs

- Formation by aggregation or de-aggregation
- Personal, culturally based and territorial federalism
- Two-tiered and three tiered federations
- Symmetric and asymmetric federalism
- Integrated and divided federalism
- Federalism in a parliamentary or presidential system
- Executive federalism
- Cooperative and competitive federalism
- Dual and administrative federalism
- Umpire-judicially backed and politically resolved

Rationales and determinants







Alternatives

- Most federalism debates take place in unitary states
 - Main difference: no constitutional guarantee and no guaranteed shared-rule
 - Territorial approach:
 - Federation, federacy, confederation, league alliance
 - Unitary state: Decentralization, devolution, deconcentration and delegation
 - Other approaches: Cultural federation, consociation, multi-culturalism, centripetalism, ethnic nation-state

For the external supporter

- Understanding of historical legacies
- Transparency of historical biases
- Common understanding of terminology
- Reflection on own background
- Advantages and disadvantages of federal design are dependent on further aspects
- Discuss alternatives and additional safeguards until decision is taken

For the external supporter

- Engage on process
 (sequencing, representation, ...)
- What are the quality criteria for good processes in the particular context?
- Federalism debates as trust building
- Peace and national dialogue processes: stay at level of principles
- National dialogues: attractive but with clear mandate
- Constitution-making: is always needed, ownership is crucial



How to overcome obstacles?

For the external supporter

- Vision influences design
- Work on clarifying visions whenever possible
- Do not move to solutions too fast
- Reframe otherwise categorical debates, avoid dividing terminology
- Compromises across topics
- Adding or reducing complexity
- Acknowledge fears and hopes
- Manage expectations
- Work on misconceptions
- Try to provide space for the above




On Substance

- How to demarcate federal units
- How to distribute powers and resources
- What to consider in establishing a second chamber of parliament
- How much importance shall federalism give to ethnic diversity
- Shall federal units have their own Constitution
- Do federal units have a right to self-determination
- When do federations fail
- What aspects of federal design determine how centralized or non-centralized a federation is

After the debate is part of the debate

- Implementation is key
- The process for deciding on federalism will impact on the chance of implementation
- Debates on implementation are a reality check





Who is doing what when with what kind of resources? What is the plan B?

Coordination, Steering, Monitoring, institutional reform (Parliament, Courts, Public Administration, Commissions, Police), elections, institution-building, alignment of legislation, intergovernmental relations, fiscal arrangements, sector-wide support, dialogue and mediation
