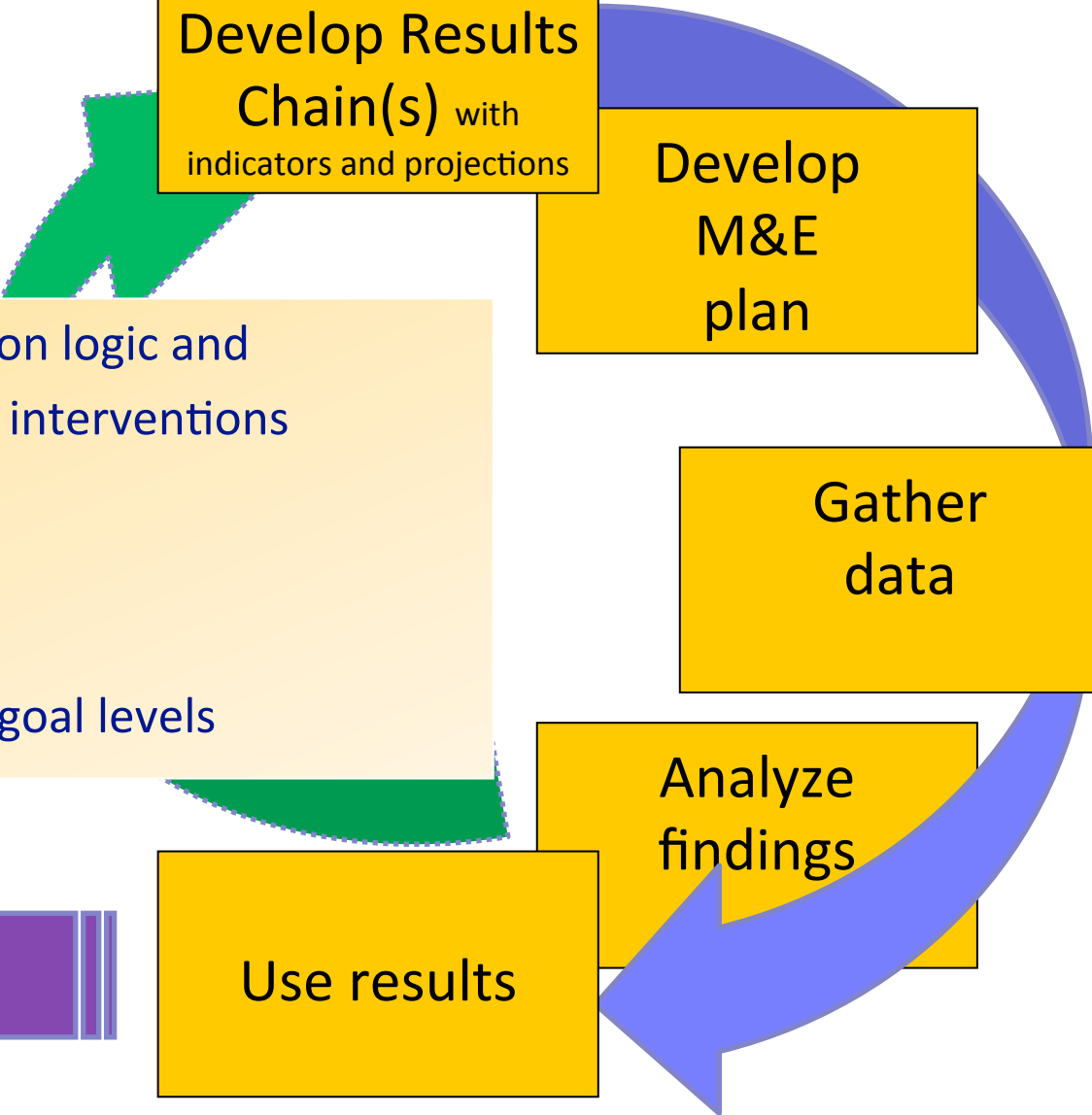
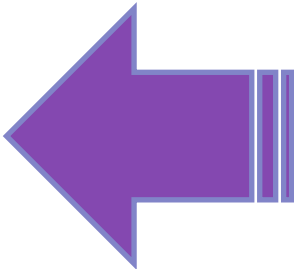

The Key Elements of the Standard

- 1. Articulating the results chain**
- 2. Defining indicators of change**
- 3. Measuring changes in indicators**
- 4. Estimating attributable changes**
- 5. Capturing wider change in the system**
- 6. Tracking programme costs**
- 7. Reporting results**
- 8. Managing the system for results measurement**

1.1 A results chain is articulated explicitly for each of the selected interventions

1.4 The review process includes adequate consultation with programme stakeholders



Compliance criteria for each control point

- For systems **in place**
- For systems **in use**

The fundamentals:

- There is a practical measurement *system*
- *Staff* use the system in their daily work
- The results chains are regularly *reviewed*
- The system produces *credible* figures
