BETH KOIGI

Beth Koigi is a Kenyan entrepreneur working to improve the access of water for off-grid communities. Koigi is a founder of Majik Water, a company which aims to harvest drinking water from the air to serve communities across the world who are not able to access safe, clean drinking water. Koigi earned a Bachelor of Science in Community Development, Project Planning and Management from Chuka University, Kenya, and a Masters in Project Planning and Management from the University of Nairobi. Following her bachelor's degree, she was a founder of Aqua Clean Initiative, founded in 2013. Koigi was awarded the Young Water Fellowship in September 2018, and has been a current associate fellow of the Royal Commonwealth Society, Nordic Baltic Hub since April 2015.

REYASAT CHOWDHURY

Reyasat Chowdhury is an entrepreneur and an avid self-learner who is passionate about using his skills to generate a positive social impact. His passion for Entrepreneurship led him to start his first venture, Shuttle, where he is currently working as the Co-founder and CEO. Shuttle addresses and aims to solve one of the biggest problems in our country – transportation for women. For his efforts in the transportation sector of Bangladesh, he was selected as the winner of the Young Achiever of the Year 2019 award by the Bangladesh branch of Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport (CILT Bangladesh).

Reyasat previously worked at Robi Axiata Limited as a Product Specialist for two years where he received the Star Performer of the Quarter (Q3, 2017) award. Born and brought up in Chittagong, he currently lives in Niketon, Dhaka with his parents. He is a business graduate from North South University (NSU) where he was the Founding President of NSU Finance Club and led the successful establishment of the club.
