
From this morning

- Men and women have multiple roles


→Need to move beyond generalizations or stereotypes about men and women

Potential gains from closing the gender gap in agriculture


- Productivity gains
 - 20 to 30 percent on women's farms
 - 2.5 to 4 percent at national level
- Food security gains
 - significant reduction in the number of hungry
- Broader economic and social gains
 - better health, nutrition and education outcomes for children
 - improved human capital, which promotes economic growth








Agricultural Value Chain
