








Drivers of Poverty and Exclusion

- Development potential: Women play an important productive & reproductive role; Their individual and collective empowerment has positive impact across all SDGs

Definition

- Gender: above all a social construct; including diverse forms of gender identity and sexual orientation
- Gender Equality: Equal opportunities and rights, sharing of power and responsibilities, recognition of different needs, interests and priorities
- Empowerment of Women and Girls: Women and girls gaining power, agency control, independence for a self-determined life.

Vision

All Human Beings enjoy equal opportunities and rights to participate in political, economic and social life, benefit from public resources and services and live a life free of violence, regardless of their sex, gender identity and expression

Commitment: Gender Positive and Transformative Results, Reducing the Gender Gap



Gender Transformative

Challenges, alters harmful gender norms, roles and relations

Gender Positive

Addresses specific needs, improves opportunities and ensures benefits for both men and women

Gender Sensitive

Includes women in activities; addresses practical needs

Gender Neutral

Ignores gender norms, roles and relations, weather -/+ effects

Gender Negative

Reinforces or perpetuates existing gender inequalities
