Interview with a Swiss expert in Risk Management working in Morocco

Since 2015, Urs Nigg works as a DRR expert seconded by SDC to the Ministry of Interior of the Government of Morocco. This collaboration was initiated in the aftermath of the earthquake in 2004 and has meanwhile considerably evolved from recovery, preparedness, prevention and now deals with the institutionalization of DRR through this secondment. The field reality is not always linear, but might also present unexpected opportunities for synergies and entry points to share Swiss know-how and experience. Publications

A guide for masons to build safer houses with confined masonry

Practical Action published a guide for masons based on the longstanding experience of the SDC/SHA expert group on construction. The guide focuses on confined masonry, which is often adopted in earthquake-prone regions. This construction type consists of masonry walls with reinforced concrete elements to confine the masonry wall panels. This method has been developed by practitioners rather than engineers and refers to the technical and financial capacities of self-builders. The guide with simple illustrations and instructions is addressed to masons, construction workers, contractors, technicians, architects and students of architecture and civil engineering.

CEDRIG application in a horticulture project in Cambodia

The horticulture project CHAIN in Cambodia aims to integrate DRR, Climate Change Adaptation and environmental aspects in their interventions. Through the application of the CEDRIG-tool, in a close collaboration between SDC and its implementing partners, the main risks and problems were identified in order to define concrete measures supporting the resilience of horticulture smallholders. Have a look at the initial assessments (CEDRIG Light) and the more detailed studies (CEDRIG Operational) to get an idea how CEDRIG can be used to improve your projects.

Project news

China - Capacity building for Dam Safety

The sustainability of water retention infrastructure is one of the most efficient measures against catastrophic floods, droughts or dam breaks, particularly in China with over 98'000 dams across the country. The Sino-Swiss Dam Safety Enhancement Program (DaSEP) focuses on the efficiency of dam safety regulations, which concluded recently with the adoption of the Chinese Dam Supervision Regulation. The project data were translated into an e-learning course and disseminated to 97'000 small and middle-sized dam operators in China, which also gained the interest of the Myanmar Government. The project was presented at the International Conference on Water Resources and Renewable Energy Development in Vietnam in March 2018.

Peru - User-tailored climate services to support farmers for extreme weather and climate events

Seasonal and climate change related weather variations are highly relevant for survival and livelihoods planning of local farmers. Learn more about the CLIMANDES project and how the Peruvian and Swiss weather services have joined forces to deliver early warnings, daily weather predictions as well as seasonal

forecasts in local languages.

Bolivia - Support by the FOEN for the phasing out of the SDC DRR Programme

Since 2005, SDC supports Bolivian partners to develop their DRR capacities in the field of prevention, preparedness and risk transfer. In the view of the forthcoming phasing out of the SDC DRR Programme in Bolivia in 2018, a smooth handover of state-of-the-art instruments to the Bolivian counterparts is crucial. The Swiss Federal Office for the Environment (FOEN) supported SDC through a review of elaborated DRR instruments and key documents. The review revealed that the availability and use of systematic information on hazards remains a challenge. FOEN recommended to the Bolivian partners to continue their capacity development and plans a 5-day training for national specialists in water and landslide-related hazard and risk analyses in April 2018.

This technical support by FOEN to SDC is based on an institutional collaboration agreement framework. Interested SDC divisions can access FOEN's DRR expertise by contacting the Focal Point of the SDC DRR Network, Jacqueline Schmid.

Strengthened stakeholder engagement and partnership with UNISDR

On 20/21 February 2018 UNISDR hosted an event for non-state actors with the participation of over 50 representatives of the "Major Groups" (NGOs, Women, Children & Youth, Indigenous People, Older Persons, Persons with disabilities, Volunteers, Farmers, Local communities, Migrants, Local Authorities, Workers & Trade Unions; Business and Industry, Science & Technology, Education & Academia), UNISDR partnership groups (Private Sector Alliance, Science & Technology Advisory Group, Resilient Cities Campaign) and UNISDR of various departments, including SRSG Robert Glaser. The event focused on UNISDR partnership options to better include non-state actors to promote the implementation of the Sendai Framework and in preparation of the Global Platform on DRR (GPDRR) to be held in Geneva in May 2019. >> read more about the event

Global Risks 2018 in the context of the World Economic Forum (WEF)

Extreme weather events, natural disasters and the failure of climate-change mitigation rank among the three top global risks. This has been stated by the annual Global Risk Report 2018, based on perceptions of an annual survey with around 1'000 members of WEF's multi-stakeholder communities. This trends points out that environmental risks have significantly grown over the 13 year history of the Global Risk Report.
