** October 13 - International DRR Day **

Dear SDC DRR Network members, dear colleagues

Unbearable and sad losses caused by the tsunami in Indonesia just two weeks ago remind us of the forces of nature and the tremendous suffering they can inflict. At the time of writing this editorial, the question remains whether this human suffering could have been avoided - why was the early warning system not effective? Which element of the system failed? How must the interplay between technological solutions, capacities and awareness be improved? The world community, on October 13, 'celebrates' the [International Day for Disaster Reduction](#), encouraging every citizen and government to take part in building more disaster-resilient communities. The DRR Day shall promote the notion of investing in prevention and preparedness, and undertaking all possible actions to reduce the occurrence of disastrous effects caused by natural events. Reducing risks is an ongoing challenge, and measures need to take into account all possible elements of the present and future risks.

[Understanding and Managing Disaster Risks and Water under Climate Change](#) was the topic of a seminar held last month in Khorog, Tadzhikistan. An integrated approach is promoted by SDC for the sustainable natural resource management, and watershed management to reduce negative impacts of natural hazards and climate risks and improve the safety of mountain communities and their infrastructure. The seminar was attended by SDC and SECO colleagues, and local partners from the public and the private sector and civil society. The seminar made a significant contribution in understanding the interrelation of sectors, and the undeniable need to fill knowledge gaps with relation to climate change effects for anticipating future risks and challenges.

Updated SDC Guidelines on DRR

The SDC Guidelines on DRR have been revised to account for new international agendas and new trends. The revised guidelines provide orientation on how to systematically manage disaster risks and on how to integrate a risk perspective in planning and operational processes. Furthermore, the document outlines SDC's approach to increase the coherence of policy processes related to DRR.

CEDRIG: Russian version and experience factsheet

To make the CEDRIG tool available to a wider range of SDC country offices and local partners the tool and its platform are now available also in Russian. Have a look at the factsheet which summarizes all CEDRIG highlights of the past years. Since the launch of the CEDRIG Platform in 2016, our community has constantly grown and includes now more than 350 users from 46 countries.

En el marco del proyecto “Bases Ambientales para la Sostenibilidad Alimentaria Local (BASAL)” se aplicaron los tres modulos de la herramienta: el CEDRIG light como base, el CEDRIG estratégico para tres principales resultados de BASAL y el CEDRIG operacional para tres proyectos prioritarios asociados. Tanto el proceso como los resultados de esta aplicación constituye insumos importantes para el desarrollo y la planificación del proyecto. El evento se organizó en mayo 2018 en Cuba incluyendo una visita

de terreno. En el evento regional participaron 24 técnicos e investigadores Cubanos de instituciones nacionales, provinciales y municipales y dos funcionarios de ONGs de Nicaragua y Honduras. Para todos fue una excelente oportunidad de capacitación en CEDRIG, gestión de riesgos y cambio climático.

Suiza apoya la Gobernanza del Riesgo de desastres en Centroamérica

El proyecto de Gobernanza del riesgo de desastres en Centroamérica, auspiciado por Suiza promueve espacios de diálogo y concertación entre los diferentes actores públicos y privados de Centroamérica. El proyecto fomenta la coordinación, transparencia y rendición de cuentas para una gestión de riesgos más efectiva.



Switzerland publishes the updated strategy 'management of risks from natural hazards'

The Swiss National Platform for Natural Hazards (PLANAT) updated its Strategy, considering current environmental conditions such as the higher incidence of extreme weather events and increasing utilisation of our living environment. The strategy contributes to securing Switzerland's living and business environment for the long term.

Community-based DRR measures build resilience in the Swat Valley in Pakistan

The remote Swat Valley of Pakistan is frequently hit by hydro-meteorological disasters. SDC implements preparedness and mitigation measures, which are crucial to save communities' lives and protect their assets. In Chail Valley, SDC in partnership with WFP, adopted an innovative approach with an integrated project related to DRR, food security and livelihoods. The project mobilizes local knowledge, expertise and resources supported by the technical guidance from experts. It capitalizes these pooled resources to solve local problems related to food security and disasters. Based on positive results the project has been extended to FATA region of Pakistan. In view of SDC's phase-out from Pakistan the initiative shall be consolidated and scaled up.





Swiss support to the Pakistan National Disaster Risk Management Fund (NDRMF)

The Embassy of Switzerland in Pakistan and ADB signed an agreement to support the NDRMF, which promotes investments in DRR. SDC contributes with 1.5 million CHF and provides technical assistance through the secondment of a Disaster Risk Finance Specialist.

Switzerland and the World Bank support the City Resilience Programme

The City Resilience Program aims to assist city governments in building resilience to climate and disaster risks, which requires strong intersectoral partnerships and new sources of capital. The programme tackles gaps in technical expertise and access to capital, its milestones and achievements are summarized in a two-page document.



Swiss engagement for the implementation of the Sendai Framework for DRR

Switzerland co-hosts the Global Platform for DRR in May 2019

The sixth Session of the Global Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction (GP2019) will take place in Geneva from 13 to 17 May 2019.



The event is convened and organized by the UN Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNISDR) and hosted and co-chaired by the Government of Switzerland. The GP2019 will integrate the outcomes of the regional DRR conferences in 2018 for a continuous implementation of the Sendai Framework (SFDRR). Compendium of Good Practices in DRR: Brown Bag Lunch presentation and summary video

The Swiss NGO DRR Platform and CDE presented an overview of its new publication "Where people and their land are safer - A Compendium of Good Practices in DRR" in the frame of a SDC Brown Bag Lunch which is also summarized in a short video.

Overview on natural disasters 2017

The Centre for Research on the Epidemiology of Disasters (CRED) summarized facts and figures of disaster events in 2017. Read more about relevant events, economic losses and disaster affected regions in the six-pager overview.

GFDRR Building Back Better report (2018)

This World Bank / GFDRR report advocates for faster, stronger and more inclusive post-disaster reconstruction for resilience, with examples from small island countries and linking with social protection/safety nets needs. The report shows the benefits of a building back better approach for communities and countries.

Role of Social Protection in DRR and Climate Change

To address communities' vulnerabilities facing climate change, disaster risks and poverty, Climate Change Adaptation (CCA), DRR and Social Protection (SP) should be considered at policy and programme level. Adaptive Social Protection refers to efforts to integrate these three elements. This research analyses the integration of CCA, DRR and SP within the institution and programmes of SDC.

New 'Center for Research of Glaciers of the Academy of Sciences' in Tajikistan

The recently launched Center does fundamental and applied research on crucial topics such as climate change impacts on glaciers, water reserves, cryosphere and hydrometeorology, expeditionary and innovative monitoring, measures against glacier melting and GLOFs.

New financing instruments for drought protection - a successfull spin-off of ARC

With the African Risk Capacity (ARC) replica the Start Network develops innovative financing instruments. Through the Start Network, its members in Senegal and Mauritania can secure funding, based upon a pre-agreed trigger, in order to protect farmers from the consequences of drought events. The initiative is a spin-off of the initial ARC programme, supported by SDC and other donors.

New insurance product for Eco-DRR through Coral Reef Protection

Swiss Re launched a new type of insurance to protect, conserve and restore coral reefs and linked to new economic opportunities. The insurance supports the economic resilience with scalable new market opportunities for the insurance industry, linked to the new Coastal Zone Management Trust.
