- Natalie Ernst (GFRAS):
  - Annual GFRAS meeting on youth and rural urban transformation: "Rural advisory services and empowered youth for balanced transformation in rural and urban communities." Further information here: <u>http://www.g-fras.org/en/annual-meeting-2017.html</u>
  - A new extensionist learning kit is available. It encompasses 13 competences to ensure and assess quality of RAS. The focus of the learning kit is on functional skills of extensionists.
- Rudolf Schoch (PAKKA): Pakka is currently assessing new supply **opportunities for Macademia nuts** in Mozambique and Kenya.
- Rudolf Luethi (Helvetas): The Rural Economy team of Helvetas currently elaborates a **new strategy.**
- Angela Deppeler and Peter Bucher (Agridea): RAS training course for strategic / institutional RAS analysis will be available in a few months. The course focuses on strategic persons or institutions in RAS and strengthens competences to analyse

RAS systems in a strategic manner and provide organisational development support. The course will be tailored to specific individual requirements.

- Felix Fellmann (SDC):
  - SDC Global Programme Food Security jointly with Syngenta Foundation and ETH Food Systems organises a one-day event on the question: "How can Africa feed itself?". 22 June 2017
  - Other events on seed systems and value chains will be organised and save the date messages shared with the SFRAS members.
  - SDC initiates a new learning journey on urban, peri-urban and rural development.
- Martin Schmidt (HEKS): HEKS will organise an international Colloquium on Access to land in Kassel, in June 2017. A follow up event will take place in Switzerland on 20<sup>th</sup> June. Information follows.
- Monique Frey (Caritas): Caritas works in least developed countries that are prone to conflict and prone to climate change. Related to RAS it is still very difficult to bring in private sector partners into these regions.
- Markus Kupper (Swisscontact): The Catalyst project in Bangladesh has been phased out and Swisscontact as capitalised experiences and evaluated impact. A number of documents on the project are available.
- Stefanie Kägi (HELVETAS)
  - Article in the magazine Rural 21 on producer organisations in organic value chains will be published in June 2017
