Organisation, Mandate and Key-Activities

The Swiss Water Partnership

- What: Multistakeholder Platform with over 70 members
- Goal: Water Security. Bring together relevant stakeholders to promote a sustainable and equitable use and management of water resources and universal access to water and sanitation.
- Vision: Globally well-recognized brand of high quality solutions for water security and the water platform in Switzerland (knowledge hub, knowledge setter and cross-sector innovation carrier)
- Why: Solidarity with water stressed countries to solve global water challenges. SWP was founded in 2012 to foster coordination and dialogue across sector and scale and promote Swiss high quality water solutions
- Key activities: Dynamic Learning, Strong Swiss Voice , Water Dialogue



Dynamic Learning

Open spaces allow to **exchange** ideas and **discuss** burning issues in the water sector with stakeholders coming from other sectors (public, research, civil society and private) and with different areas of expertise.

- Working groups deepens the knowledge > Nature Based Solutions in Water
- SWP members regularly organize **events** > Water Risks
- Conferences, SWP General Assembly and other gatherings > extending network



Strong Swiss Voice

Members of the SWP jointly organize thematic events for major **international water events** (Stockholm World Water Week, World Water Forum)

- Swiss Booth > visibility and synergies
- illustrate the member expertise to **major international donors** (WB, RdB)



Water Dialogue

Together with the SDC, the SWP contributes to the water target of the **Agenda 2030** for Sustainable Development in Switzerland and abroad in pilot countries.


- **Early position:** SWP was used as a **consultation platform** to elaborate the Swiss proposition for the SDG 6.
- The SWP members are involved in shaping the process of monitoring and implementation and advocacy of the SDG 6 indicators.

CURRENT SWP MEMBER REPARTITION BY SECTOR (2018)






2013/14: no specific water goal in the millennium goals

- A dedicated water goal gives more priority for the sector
- Draft position paper (SDC/IDANE*)
- SWP was invited by SDC to make national consultation.
- Process:
 - 1) Member consultation: Online survey f2f workshop
 - 2) Endorsement of the final Swiss position at the GA

2015: adoption of a dedicated water goal in the 2030 agenda

- 90% similar to the Swiss position
- interdepartementale Arbeitsgruppe Nachhaltige Entwicklung Wasser

A POST-2015 GLOBAL GOAL FOR WATER










Outcomes of the Advocacy Work

- Legitimacy: having the support of 65 Swiss organizations across sectors and scale influenced the prioritization process within the Swiss government and gives the Swiss outline more credibility at international scale.
- Ownership: The consultation process gave every SWP member the possibility to shape the Swiss position and creates a feeling of ownership. This is crucial for the advocacy activities.
- Visibility for SWP
- Foster exchange and continue to influence (monitoring & implementation)

Target Group of the Advocacy

- To create a Swiss position on the necessity to create a dedicated SDG Water Goal
- Influence from a sector perspective, not only on governmental level (e.g. WaterLex, GIWEH, Helvetas Nepal, NWP)





Recommendations for SFRAS

- Involvement of different stakeholders creates ownership
- Make sure the advocacy efforts are well coordinated and continuous (mobilization of actors to advocate)
- Finances for advocacy work: (2012/2013): Position paper accounted for...
 - ...41% of Water Dialogue Pillar 2012/13
 - ...12% of the total SWP expenses 2012/13
 - The Water Dialogue Pillar accounted for 29% of the total SWP expenses 2012/13
