Policy Coherence

"Coherent Migration Policy ...

... must provide answers in the following domains:

- Integration / Reintegration / Return > Social cohesion
- Labour Market and Migration (emigration and/or immigration)
- Diasporas and their contribution to development
- Protection (refugees, IDPs, victims of human trafficking, vulnerable groups)
- International and regional networks / relationships
- Gouvernance / Management

Approaches

Perspectives on Migration

- Safe, orderly and regular migration is seen as a potential for development
- Following a holistic approach that promotes the positive effects of migration and reduces associated risks at all stages of the migration cycle (before, during and after migration)
- Promoting policy coherence within migration policy (wholeof-government approach)
- Comprehensive approach that includes internal, South-South and South-North migration
- → Human Rights Framework and Do No Harm-principle
- → Context-sensitive, conflict-sensitive and gender-sensitive approach

Challenges

- Migration is a complex process, based on individual decisions, that happens with or without external intervention
- Mixed migration flows (e.g. refugees, displaced persons and migrants)
- Migration is a task for numerous actors and policy areas, all have their own perspective
- Legal Migration and development prospects in partner countries are interlinked
- Development shapes migration and vice versa
- Causes of migration, migration processes and impacts of migration do not take place at the same time

A comprehensive understanding of the effects of migration and how they relate to migrants' objectives is needed!

Enabling framework conditions along the migration cycle and in all contexts

- → Safe and regular and decent work for labour migrants
- → Framework conditions for migrants' contribution to sustainable development (in countries of origin, transit and destination)
- → Development oriented solutions to forced displacement



Evidence generation


Knowledge, Advisory Services and Collaboration

- → The M&D expertise within SDC and with partners is strengthened through GPMD advisory services


